CONTEXT

Mass Gatherings can have real benefits. However, COVID-19 shows that they can threaten human health. More and more people are moving around Central Asia (e.g., the Belt and Road initiative), and increasing numbers of Mass Gatherings could present problems. This project presents a series of activities that will strengthen and empower Mass Gathering health preparedness and response in the region.

OVERALL OBJECTIVE

The overall objective of the project is to strengthen and empower preparedness and response for Mass Gatherings in Central Asia through a series of assessment, scientific activities, preparedness and training measures.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- 1. Improving Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) at Mass Gatherings by improving the safety of food and water through food hygiene training;
- Guarding against chemical threats by developing Poison Information Centres;
- 3. Ensuring that Public Health Command, Control and Communication (C3) systems provide rapid, regular, and transparent communications;
- 4. Ensuring that Mass Gatherings' stakeholders are properly resourced;
