FRAMEWORK: European Union (EU) Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear (CBRN) Risk Mitigation Centres of Excellence (CoE) Initiative. Funded by the European Union and jointly implemented by the EU and the United Nations Interregional Crime and Justice Research Institute (UNICRI).

ESTABLISHED: 6 March 2013.

LOCATION: Office of the President, Manila, Philippines.

OVERALL GOAL: Strengthen capabilities of Partner Countries to mitigate CBRN risks, whether natural, accidental, or deliberate in origin.

- 4 ▶ Collect information and assist in the monitoring of ongoing CBRN CoE projects.
- 5 ▶ Organise regional Round-Table Meetings.
- 6 ▶ Enhance ownership by Partner Countries in the region.
- 7 ▶ Reach out to and coordinate with regional and international partners.

Methodology



National Focal Points (NFPs): Lead CBRN CoE activities at the country-level, participate in regional and international Round-Table Meetings and liaise with the Regional Secretariat and relevant regional and international partners. All **10 Partner Countries** have appointed NFPs.



National Teams (NTs): Inter-agency teams identify national priorities for capacity-building, participate in CBRN CoE projects and work towards the establishment of comprehensive and integrated national CBRN risk mitigation policies. To date, **7 Partner Countries** (Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar, Philippines, Thailand, Viet Nam) have established NTs within the framework of the CBRN CoE and **2 Partner Countries** (Malaysia, Singapore) established equivalent teams prior to joining the CBRN CoE.



National Action Plans (NAPs): Identify strategic actions for capacity-building. To date, **3 Partner Countries** (Cambodia, Philippines, Viet Nam) have completed and officially adopted NAPs within the framework of the CBRN CoE, **3 Partner Countries** (Brunei Darussalam, Lao PDR, Myanmar) have NAPs at an advanced stage, and **3 Partner Countries** (Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand) established equivalent plans prior to joining the CBRN CoE.

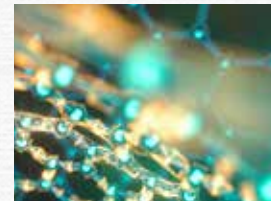
Projects

Recent Achievements

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, between May 2020 and July 2021, the CBRN CoE Regional Secretariat for Southeast Asia delivered a peer-to-peer webinar series to exchange knowledge and experience on the regional and global COVID-19 response, reaching over 1,000 participants.



In late 2022 and early 2023, CBRN CoE Project 62, with the support of the International Security and Emergency Management Institute (ISEMI), worked with Cambodian authorities to strengthen the country's CBRN response capacity in advance of the 2023 Southeast Asian Games.



In March 2023, the CBRN CoE Regional Secretariat for Southeast Asia organised a 10-year anniversary event to celebrate a 10-year anniversary since the Secretariat's inauguration and to showcase the capacity-building achievements of Partner Countries in the region.
