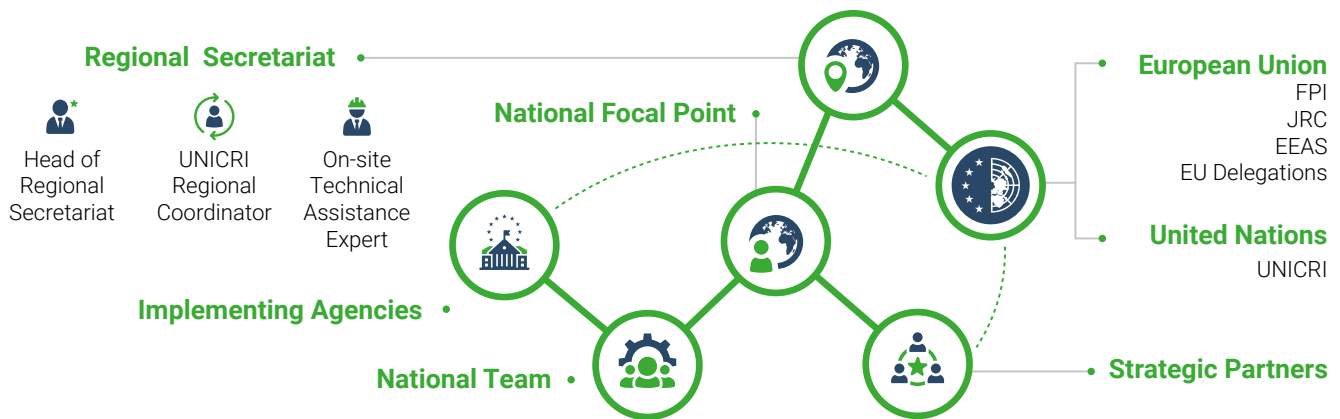

Methodology

- 1 Support Partner Countries in identifying CBRN Risk Mitigation needs and priorities.
- 2 Develop regional and sub-regional project proposals to address the needs of Partner Countries.
- 3 Support Partner Countries in the establishment and the institutionalisation of CBRN Training centers and Programs.
- 4 Support Partner countries' ownership of the development and implementation of CBRN capability building structures, activities, and cross-border exercises.
- 5 Facilitate the provision of CBRN technical assistance to Partner Countries.
- 6 Reinforce regional cooperation in the GCC, including a reinforced coordination with the GCC Emergency Management Centre.

Recent Achievements

Project P82 on Medical Preparedness and Response to CBRN Incidents in the GCC region enhanced the expertise of 100+ trainers from GCC countries, which increased the national and regional capacity to train future generations of first- and second-line responders to CBRN incidents. Phase 2 of Project 82 further strengthened national capabilities during country-specific training sessions in Kuwait and the UAE.

On-demand expert missions in 2023 and 2024 assessed current CBRN capabilities, including strengths and risks, and identified opportunities and areas of potential improvement in UAE.

Kuwait heightened the medical readiness of the State of Kuwait in dealing with radiation emergencies with the organisation of an EU-supported Radiation Emergency Training course on "Medical Response to Radiation Emergencies" in June 2024.
