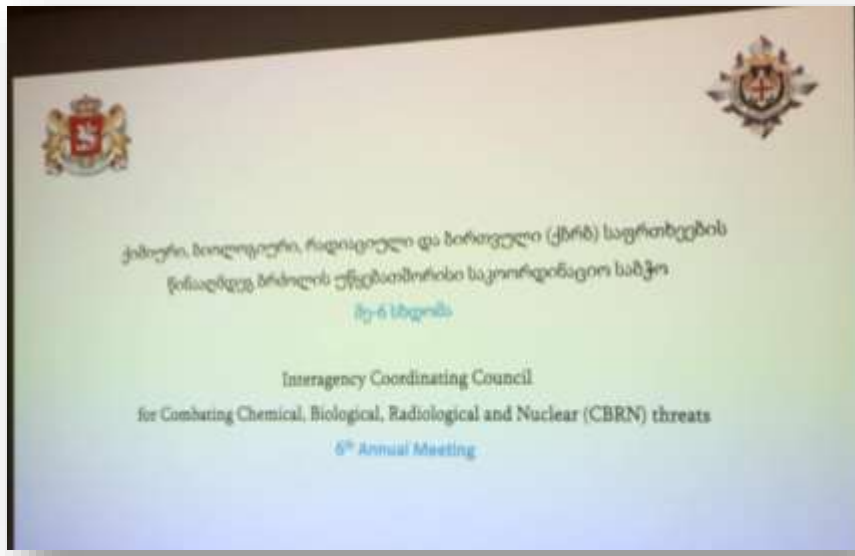

Interagency Coordinating Council for Countering CBRN Threats

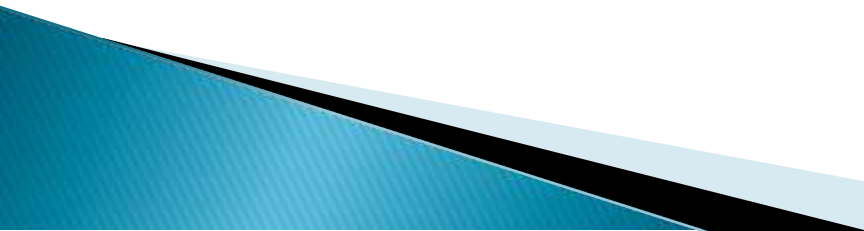
- ▶ **Founded in 2014 by the governmental decree**

National CBRN Team consisted of 28 agencies from the below ministries

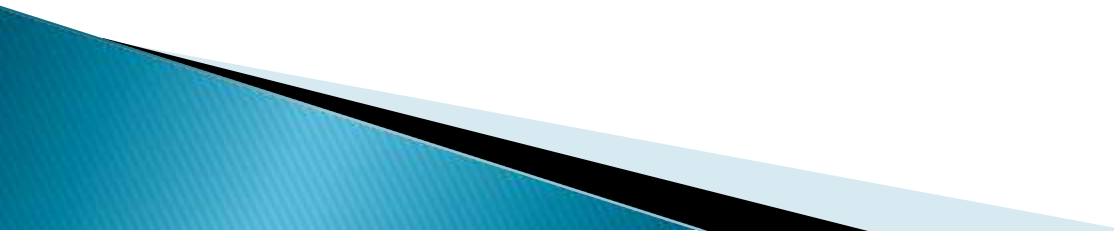
- ▶ **State Security Service – chair agency**
 - Ministry of Internal Affairs
 - Ministry of Environment Protection and Agriculture
 - Ministry of Internally Displaced Persons from the occupied Territories, Labor, Health and Social Protection
 - Ministry of Defence
 - Ministry of Foreign Affairs
 - Ministry of Finance



Secretariat of the Council

- ▶ Ensures the administration of the activities of the Council, conducts council meetings and provides analytical support
 - ▶ Contributes to the implementation of the CBRN Action Plan
 - ▶ Works with the council agencies to identify challenges in the NAP implementation process that require external assistance from donor organizations
 - ▶ Supports the coordination of CBRN projects and initiatives at the national, regional and international levels
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Interagency coordination

- ▶ Council meets annually to review progress and discuss implementation
 - ▶ NAP progress updates show the gaps and challenges related to each action
 - ▶ Council working groups conducted regularly based on needs/issues
 - ▶ Working groups identify the actions requiring donor assistance
 - ▶ Donor coordination meetings conducted as needed
