





Spectrum of biological risks




Programme Goals



- The German Biosecurity Programme contributes to raising awareness of and minimizing the risks emanating from dangerous pathogens, including the potential for a deliberate misuse of biological agents for (terrorist) attacks.
- It contributes to Germany's preventive security policy.

Biological Weapons Convention (BWC)

 Article X calls for cooperation and assistance among States Parties in the exchange of equipment, materials, and scientific and technological information for the use of biological agents and toxins for peaceful purposes.



G7-led Global Partnership



Global Partnership against the Spread of Weapons and Materials of Mass Destruction:

- Established at Kananaskis Summit in 2002
- Japan holding the Presidency in 2023
- 31 members, including the EU
- More than 2 billion EUR spent on projects last year
- Biological Security Working Group
- Africa Signature Initiative


Our Programme
